Oral presentation guidelines

- Please prepare your presentation using PowerPoint. PowerPoint should be 16:9 inch wide. Slides should be not more than 20 slides.
- Please send us your *ppt file at least 5 days before workshop. If presenter has any correction please bring your presentation in USB, and ensure you have back-up.
- Please arrive at least 15 minutes early to the room designated for your presentation (Check the conference programme in the delegate pack for these details).
- Summer crop workshop room is equipped with a PC computer, one projector and one large screen.
- Please stick to time. Presentation time will be of 15 minutes with 5 minutes for questions. If you exceed allowed time, the chair will have to stop you.

Posture presentation guidelines

- Poster format is A0 vertical (841x 1189 mm).
- Poster title should be identical to the title of the accepted abstract.
- Remember that the viewer has to be able to read the text from a distance of up to 1 to 1.5 m.
- The conference programme will list your name and poster title together with a designated poster number.
- Please set up your poster on the board where your number is displayed. Conference staff will help you to locate the correct area.
- Posters will be on display during the whole conference.
- Please, arrange to be at your poster during your designated time.
- All posters have to be removed at the end of the summer crop workshop by the presenter. If you have to leave before your dismantling time, please designate a colleague to be responsible for removing your poster.
- Any posters remaining after the workshop may be disposed.
- Please view the poster template and size of the text in different section of the poster for your reference.

Author Guidelines for Manuscript

- i) Manuscript must follow the author's guidelines of "Journal of Nepal Agricultural Research Council".
- ii) Abstract should be in English with 250 words.
- iii) The font of the manuscript must be in Times New Roman.
- iv) The Results and Discussion chapter must be in separate headings.
- v) Coordinators report, review papers, research notes have specific format so they do not need separate headings of results and discussion.
- vi) The references must follow the guidelines of "Journal of Nepal Agricultural Research Council".
- vii) The manuscripts which do not follow the provided instructions would not be entertained for publication; therefore, please study the guidelines seriously and review your own paper repeatedly before submitting to us.
